Pastor Sarah's Reflection

This October we are journeying together through a series entitled, "Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity." Our series is based on the book by the same name written by Rev. Adam Hamilton.

I first came across Hamilton's book a number of years ago when serving in Frederick, Maryland. Chris and I were new parents, right in the throes of balancing two careers, parenthood and the regular financial pressures life brings. We had figured out some solid financial habits, but like many in that place in life, often it was all we could do to get through each day.

This was the time in my life (well, and the next couple of years as we also welcomed Mary) when I deeply resonated with a quote by *Harry Potter* author J.K. Rowling, who when speaking about balancing writing and being a single mother, said in 2001, "Everything was just very very dilapidated and always filthy which wasn't the flat's fault — it was normally my fault because people very often say to me, "How did you do it? How did you raise a baby and write a book?" and the answer is, I didn't do housework for four years! I'm not Superwoman, and living in squalor that was the answer."

Well, let's be honest—this quote still resonates with me! There is, every single day, simply SO MUCH to keep up with. And sometimes healthy habits around financial habits become, simply, just *one more thing* that I don't feel like I have time for.

The thing is, time and again experts tell us that financial anxieties are a great source not only of personal stress, but also tension in marriages, organizations, churches, communities and indeed, even nations. Money is a topic many of us we raised to avoid in social gatherings, and so instead of developing healthy and appropriate ways to talk about money, we instead learned to bury the topic, hide or mask our anxiety around anything related to money, and then when circumstances *force* the topic to be brought forth, we often fall apart in our attempts to have reasoned discussions about it.

Given the great power that money (the management of it, the lack of enough of it, an abundance of it, or the mis-use of it), clearly God cares how we earn, save, and spend our money. Retired Bishop Joe Yeakel is remembered for having often remarking to people that if they showed him their checkbook, he could tell them where their heart is. Indeed, our use, management and love of money does often reveal our true focus, even when our words might suggest otherwise.

So, this month, I do want to challenge you to examine your own financial practices, decisions and goals. We will finish our series the next two weeks as we reflect together on how we can cultivate contentment in our lives and how we can move into a life of generosity. I hope you will join us Sundays at 10 am.

1. Put God first in your living and giving.

2. Prepare a spending plan and track all expenses monthly.

(Proverbs 27:23-24)

Provide immediately for an emergency fund.

(1 Timothy 6:9-12)

5. Pay off all credit card debt and use cash, not credit cards.
