Pastor Sarah's Reflection

One of my favorite things about social media these days, for all its negative effects, is its ability to help remind us of some of the great moments of our lives. One of the primary ways I do this is through the "Memories" app on Facebook, which allows me, each day, to see posts on that date in previous years. Most of those memories are good ones—though some indeed are bittersweet or even just plain hard. As you might imagine, many of my posts, especially those including photos, involve our daughters Anna and Mary.

In a world of posed photos—including those infamous school photos—I treasure the photos I have of our girls in natural, un-posed moments. When I try to get the girls to smile for a photo, posed nicely and looking happy for the camera, inevitably, the photos are awkward. Apparently even our bodies know forced smiles are, well, forced. We can try to act happy, but not even all that well. And we certainly can't pretend to be joyful. I usually have to take twenty posed photos to get one that seems natural. Acting happy isn't easy.

As I look through those old photos on Facebook most days, I see special moments of smiles, laughter and yes, joy (because let's be honest, we don't usually post the photos mid-meltdown!).

Pure joy. Unfiltered, un-posed, real, not pretend joy. Not for my sake, or the camera, or my Facebook friends, just joy because that was what the moment called for.

Have you ever had someone say, "Smile," to you? I don't mean for a photo. I mean just going through your day. Maybe at work, or the store? If you're a man, perhaps you have not. If you're a woman, I bet you have. Especially as a young woman.

We seem to have equated smiling with happiness, and happiness with our main goal in life. We say we want our children to be happy, want our friends to be happy. We celebrate, indeed especially around Christmas, the mere appearance of happiness.

In so doing, we miss the power of joy.

Happiness can often be shallow. Joy is deep.

Happiness is light, airy, and in difficult times, quite elusive.

Joy meets us when the depth of our spirit finds light even in dark times. Joy can bear the difficult times. It powers us through our days. It draws us deep into the well of authenticity, wholeness and holiness that God created us for.

This Sunday, our theme for the 3rd Sunday of Advent is joy. We reflect on this theme powerfully on the Sunday the Church also traditionally tells the story of Mary. In the midst of the challenge path that God invited her to walk along, it seems to be shallow to expect her to have started that journey with happiness. But I do believe, and the Church has taught across the ages, that she did so with joy. We hear that joy in the words of the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55), and we can easily envision it as she held her newborn baby. Even with all the pressures and uncertainties, her faith in God and confidence in God's abiding presence with her filled her with joy.

Pastor Sarah's Reflection - Con't.

I pray that as you look back on the days of your life, you see glimpses of happiness—but I hope you also see moments of joy. Joy that can sustain you even today. Joy that is born anew in your heart, in your life this day. May you know how deeply God delights in you. How giddy with joy your God is when you find joy in each day, and strength for the journey. And may this Advent and Christmas season pour even more joy into your life!
